Review of Filing Process

- 2014 & 2015 banked totals provided on April 28th
- Retail Load Obligations provided on May 2nd
- Compliance Workbook/Instructions on May 19th
- End of 2016 trading year is June 15th
- Alternative Compliance Payments (ACPs) must be submitted to the Massachusetts CEC by June 27th
- Compliance filings due no later than Monday, July 3rd
- Filers must provide *both* electronic and hard copies of filing
- **NEW!** Obligatory naming & formatting convention for all quarterly "Settled Certificates" GIS reports
- Electronic copies must be submitted only to <u>DOER.RPS@state.ma.us</u>.

Review of Applicable 2016 Compliance Exemptions & Variations

- Pre-6/28/13 Minimum Standard (%) Bifurcation for Solar Carve-Out
 - Minimum Standard % depends on Contract dates
 - Load under pre-6/28/13 contracts has 0.9801% Minimum Standard
 - Load under later contracts has 1.7568% Minimum Standard
 - For all suppliers
- Pre-4/25/14 Minimum Standard Exemption for Solar Carve-Out II
 - Exempts all Load served under retail contracts executed before 4/25/2014
 - Load under later contracts has 0.7851% Minimum Standard
 - For competitive retail suppliers only
- For CY 2017 (*not 2016*): Pre-5/8/16 Minimum Standard (%) Bifurcation for Solar Carve-Out II



Compliance Strategies and Best Practices

- Auction [Re-minted] SRECs
 - > 2013 Auction SRECs *must* be used for 2016 compliance.
 - > 2014 Auction SRECs *must* be used for 2016 compliance.
 - > 2015 Auction SREC Is can be used for 2016 and 2017 compliance.
- Auction [Re-minted] SREC IIs
 - > 2015 Auction SREC IIs can be used for 2016 and 2017 compliance.
- All Auction SRECs for use in 2017 should remain in your main GIS account or your Banked account, **not** in your state-specific subaccount.

Compliance Strategies and Best Practices

- Banking certificates
 - DOER recommends that Suppliers avail themselves of their ability to bank certificates whenever possible
 - Banking limits are expressed as a percentage of a Supplier's 2016 compliance obligation
 - Banked certificates can be used in one of the two subsequent compliance years
 - > Banking limits are as follows for specific classes:
 - RPS Class I 30%
 - SREC I and SREC II 10%
 - RPS Class II Renewable 30%
 - RPS Class II Waste-to-Energy 5% (had been 0% for 2014 & 2015)
 - APS 30%
- Settle all certificates in MA subaccounts at GIS before June 15th
 - Unsettled & other "Errant" certificates create accounting issues, require additional documentation from Suppliers, and make it difficult for DOER to reconcile numbers.
 - DOER requests that all suppliers settle certificates before the close of the trading year. (Auction Reminted SRECs/SREC IIs excepted)



ACP Payments

- ACP Payments must be made to the Massachusetts Clean Energy Center (MassCEC) by Tuesday June 27th.
- **NEW!** ACP wire instructions and ACP Notification are now in a new last tab of the *Workbook*: tab **N**.
- You must itemize your payments according to the different types of ACPs:
 - Class I (RECs)
 - Class I Solar Carve-Out (SRECs) Class I Solar Carve-Out II (SREC IIs)
 - Class II Renewable Energy (Class II RECs)
 - Class II Waste-to-Energy (WECs)
 - Alternative Portfolio Standard (AECs)
- The MassCEC will provide an ACP Receipt that identifies ACP Credits (MWh) & Payments (\$) for each type of ACP that you remit.
- ACP Receipts must be included as part of your emailed filing only.
- If you have not received ACP Receipts by July 3rd, you should *not* delay email submission of your Compliance Filing. Instead, email the Filing on time, and then email the ACP Receipts as soon as you receive them.

2016 SREC Auction(s)

- The 2016 SREC Auction will be held before the end of July
- DOER expects to have significant auction volume in SREC II, but does not expect a large volume in SREC I
- All deposits into the auction account must be made by June 15th
- Bidders will need to register by submitting a qualification form to DOER's auction agent
- DOER expects considerable bidder interest and strongly encourages all retail suppliers to actively participate in this year's auction
- Represents a significant opportunity for suppliers to reduce their future compliance costs

Ongoing Rulemakings

- APS Rulemaking
 - > Expecting to file in the next couple of weeks
 - > Adding new eligible renewable thermal technologies
- SMART Rulemaking
 - Expecting to file in the next couple of weeks
 - All qualified projects classified as Class I
- 83D and 83C Procurements
 - > Adding supply to Class I in 2020s
