This guide will serve as a reference for you to understand the point allocation for answers to each question on the ECT&E component of a Fire Promotional Examination.

HRD reserves the right to change the point allocation or ECT&E categories for any future examination. All questions were scored based upon experience, certifications, training, and education as of the original scheduled date of the examination.

Category and Maximum allowable points

The following chart represents the categories and the maximum points available for each category. The available maximum points for each category are capped at that amount. As you review the questions and answers, you will see that the total points available for each category may exceed the maximum points available for each category. Notwithstanding that availability, the maximum points available for each category was capped when each category was scored.

As you review points allocated to each potential response, you will see that they are not distributed equally across the years of experience. The new ETC&E solicits information in a simpler format but, similar to the previous ECT&E, the new ETC&E gives a greater weight to more recent experience. Experience or Education that is more relevant or important to the position is given a higher point value.

Questions and allocated points

Q1: Asked candidate to select their department.

Q2: Asked candidate if they wish to claim 25 years of Service Promotional Preference Points.

Q3: Asked whether the candidate understood the instructions for the Experience portion of the claim.

Q4-Q11: Job Experience

Related Degree Fields: Biochemical Science, Business Administration, Business Management, Chemistry, Computer Science, Emergency Management, Engineering (Civil Engineering, Chemical Engineering, Structural Engineering, Building Construction, Fire Prevention Engineering), Fire Admin, Fire Safety, Fire Science, Fire Service, Homeland Sec./ Security and Intel. Studies, Nursing, Occupational Safety, Paramedic Medicine, Public Administration.

Non-Related Degree Fields: All other fields.

For all Fire Departmental Promotional Exams, HRD will grant ECT&E points only for whole and conferred degrees from regionally accredited higher education institutions, and not for individual semester hours or degree credits. Semester hours earned in an unfinished degree program or in a non-degree (Certificate) program are not eligible for ECT&E credit. If you have multiple conferred degrees, HRD will only credit the highest degree. For example, if you have a Bachelor's Degree in Fire Science and an Associate's Degree in Culinary Arts, HRD will only credit the highest degree (Bachelor's Degree in Fire Science). HRD only recognizes degrees granted by: a) regionally accredited higher education institutions

in the United States; or, b) institutions outside the United States granting degrees or degree program credits that are recognized by one of the United States regional accrediting agencies or that are transferable to a regionally accredited higher education institution in the United States. Indicate the highest degree you have received from a recognized (as defined above) college or university.

VERIFYING EDUCATION CLAIMS: APPLICANTS MUST SUBMIT OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS, OR AN UNOFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT AND A COPY OF THE DEGREE, FROM ALL INSTITUTIONS IN WHICH THEY ARE REQUESTING CREDIT. Scoring methodology:

You will receive an ECT&E score notice that will provide your percentage of the overall total points available in a particular category. In addition, if applicable, the score notice will describe any points that you claimed but were not credited.

The final ETC&E score that appears on your score notice will be achieved through a standardization and weighting process. You cannot add up the points based on the information in this guide to obtain the score that will represent 20% of your total overall score on the Fire Captain's examination.
