Dear Reader:

This was a very positive year in fulfilling the Board's mission. We decided 113 claims (4th highest in the last 20 years) making awards to 86 claimants totaling \$2.1 million (7th highest in the last 20 years). The individual awards ranged from \$381.92 to \$305,056.67. Happily, out of 56,279 lawyers in the Commonwealth, only 43 (now disciplined or deceased) were responsible for these misappropriations of client funds. Once again, Trusts and Estates was the category with the highest award total: \$1 million or almost half of the total awarded.

We continue to find, in addition to addressing a client's monetary loss, an expression of apology to the client for their experience is very important. We are the first representatives of the organized Bar they encounter. Clients are also very impressed by the fact that any awards come only from funds paid by members of the Bar, and no public funds are involved.

In early June, Boston served as the host city for the American Bar Association 28th National Forum on Client Protection. Supreme Judicial Court Associate Justice Margot Botsford welcomed all the participants during the opening plenary session. Our Treasurer, Denzil McKenzie, served as a co-moderator of the Forum's Town Hall Meeting during which representatives from every state fund in attendance reported on their respective successes and set-backs of the past year and challenges they face in the future. I am pleased to report that the Massachusetts Fund continues to stand alone as the fund with no limits on the amount paid to an individual claimant; the aggregate amount paid for the defalcations of an individual lawyer; and no limitations when a claim may be filed. At the same time, we share with our sister funds realistic concerns about the level and stability of our fund reserves. In my judgment, the level of support of the Supreme Judicial Court and the Bar of the Commonwealth allow our Fund to continue as a "gold standard" for client security.

Since this is my last year on the Board, I also want to emphasize the skill and collegiality of all the Board members I have been privileged to serve with these past five years. They give unselfishly of their time and talents.

In closing, I wish to express my appreciation to each member of the Supreme Judicial Court from 1974 through today for establishing and steadfastly preserving the pre-eminent position of the Massachusetts Fund. I also wish to thank each and every Massachusetts lawyer for your financial support of the Fund through your registration fees.



Board Members

John J. Egan, Esq., Chair, was appointed to the Board on December 17, 2007. As a partner in the Springfield firm of Egan, Flanagan and Cohen, P.C., he concentrates his practice in civil litigation. A graduate of the College of the Holy Cross and Boston College Law School, he was admitted to the Bar in 1969. He served as a trial attorney for the Massachusetts Defenders Committee, as an Assistant District Attorney, and as an Assistant Attorney General.
