Dear Reader,

By reimbursing more than \$1.9 million to 57 claimants during fiscal 2007, the Clients' Security Board has now awarded more than \$30.6 million to 1,535 claimants during its 33-year history.

Each and every one of those \$30+ million dollars came from Massachusetts lawyers and went to the clients of the minute fraction of Massachusetts lawyers who stole from them. The Board did this under the unswerving directive of the Supreme Judicial Court to maintain the integrity of the legal profession. This year, the individual awards ranged from \$450 to \$500,000. That \$500,000 award was the second highest individual award in Board history.

A substantial portion of the \$10,509,201 in Claims Pending (p. 6) relate to the misconduct of Morris M. Goldings who was disbarred more than five years ago. Those claims remain pending because our Board may not pay its final awards until distributions from the bankruptcy estate of his former firm have been completed. Nevertheless, this year the Board did make partial distributions of more than \$489,000 to Mr. Goldings' former clients. We hope to see the final bankruptcy distributions and Board awards during next fiscal year causing a substantial reduction in that \$10 million figure.

The Board also continued to advocate for a rule requiring insurance companies to notify third-party liability claimants when a payment of \$5,000 or more is sent to their lawyer or other representative. This rule, we believe, would reduce the numbers of claims listed in the "Settlements" category in this report. The Board solicited support for this proposal from the organized Bar, and we are pleased to report that the concept of payee notification has been endorsed by Berkshire Bar Association, Boston Bar Association, Dukes County Bar Association, Massachusetts Chapter of the Federal Bar Association and the Women's Bar Association of Massachusetts. Next year, we hope and expect to be able to report specific details regarding the implementation of this procedure.

In recognition of the ever-increasing significance of the Internet as a dominant information source in our lives, this year's annual report is more streamlined than ever before. We have eliminated the summary factual descriptions

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of the awards in each claim category and the narrative restatements of the statistical information appearing in the tables. Beginning in September 2007, abstracts of the most recent Board decisions will be promptly posted on our website. They will provide ample detail enabling the reader to understand both the conduct of the disciplined lawyer and the reasoning behind the Board’s decision on the claim. Abstracts for the preceding fiscal year will remain available.

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<p>INTRODUCTION</p> <p>In 1974, the Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court created the Clients’ Security Board and directed it to rectify the wrongful conduct of those former members of the bar who had taken advantage of clients and to strengthen public confidence in the legal profession.</p> <p>The Board consists of seven Massachusetts lawyers appointed by the Court who, as trustees, manage and distribute the Clients’ Security Fund to reimburse clients whose lawyers wrongfully took or misused client funds. Board members serve five-year terms without compensation. The lawyers who represent claimants before the Board also serve without compensation.</p> <p>All money in the Fund comes from a single source: the registration fees paid by the lawyers of Massachu-</p>	<p>sets. No taxpayer dollars or other public funds are used.</p> <p>All fifty states and the District of Columbia have similar funds. Massachusetts, however, stands apart because, over the years, the Court empowered the Board</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • to reimburse each claimant loss without limit, • to reimburse, without limit, all claims related to an individual lawyer, • to reimburse claims without imposing a statute of limitations, and • to actively solicit applications from affected populations who otherwise might never know of the Board and its mission.

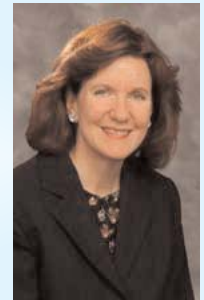
the Boston, Massachusetts and American Bar Associations, and the American Bankruptcy Institute, as well as a frequent author and lecturer in his field.

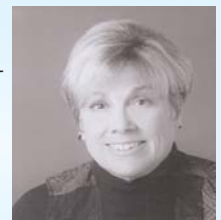

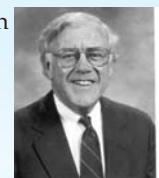
