NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Pursuant to M.G.L. chapter 7, section 3B and M.G.L. chapter 30A, the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Executive Office of Administration and Finance (A&F), in conjunction with the Division of Administrative Law Appeals, will hold a public hearing relative to proposed amendments to the Office of Administration and Finance fee regulations at 801 CMR 4.02 (“[4.02: Fees for Licenses, Permits, and Services to be Charged by State Agencies](#)”) and the Standard Adjudicatory Rules of Practice and Procedure at 801 CMR 1.00 et seq. By the proposed amendments to 801 CMR 4.02, the Executive Office of Administration and Finance is proposing changes to its fee regulations by adding a new section 801 CMR 4.02 (820 - Division of Administrative Law Appeals) relative to the fees charged by the Division of Administrative Law Appeals for certain of its services. By the proposed amendments to 801 CMR 1.00, the Executive Office of Administration and Finance is proposing to supplement its “Standard Adjudicatory Rules of Practice and Procedure by adding a new section 1.01(5), Supplementary Rules Applicable to Adjudicatory Proceedings Pursuant to G.L. c. 32, § 16(4). It is anticipated that the proposed regulation amendments will become effective on or before July 1, 2010.

The hearings will be held as follows:

Interested parties will be given an opportunity to present testimony in writing in advance of these hearings by mail or email, orally or in writing at either of these hearings and in writing during a commentary period following the date of the hearings. The commentary period will close at 5 p.m. on Monday, May 17, 2010.
