

LEED Green Associate Training and Exam
LIMIT: 30; Members Must Act Fast!

The US Green Building Council (USGBC) is offering professional credentials for engineers, facility managers and construction professionals for green buildings that are being built all across the state of Massachusetts. Two state office buildings were completed by DCAMM that have been certified as LEED Platinum, with more to come. Many young engineers and construction managers are becoming LEED accredited professionals to show that they have expertise in sustainable building practices. The first tier in the certification is LEED Green Associate, ideal for professionals newer to the field and looking to gain experience in LEED. The LEED AP credentials affirms advanced knowledge in specialized areas such as building design and construction, operation and maintenance, interior design and homes. MOSES is sponsoring LEED training for preparation to taking the LEED Green Associate exam. The cost of the training is \$200.00 and the cost to take the LEED Green Associate exam is \$250.00 totaling \$450.00. Members that complete the training will be reimbursed for the cost of the training and the exam. If you decide to take the LEED training and exam, you will not be eligible for any other reimbursements this fiscal year.

Applying for the LEED Training

The training will be an 8-hour live instruction by a LEED expert from USGBC. You will be provided a Green Building Core Concepts Guide (PDF format), 200 LEED Green Associate practice exam questions, a copy of the workshop presentation and a LEED standard reference guide. The course will be **limited to 30 participants** in this cycle, so please make note of the deadline to submit your application. If there are more than 30 applicants submitted before the deadline, we will select by lottery and those not included will be first in line for the next class.

The LEED v4 Exam Questions Reflect Task Domains and Knowledge Domains

Task Domains: Task Domains reflect the tasks necessary to perform LEED safely and effectively. These include concepts such as LEED Project and Team Coordination, LEED Certification Process, Analyses Required for LEED Credits and Advocacy and Education for Adoption for LEED Rating System.

- LEED Green Associate Tasks (100%) [How to take the exam - not LEED project administration tasks, these would be for the LEED AP exam]

Knowledge Domains: Knowledge Domains reflect the rating systems' credit categories and what one needs to know. These include concepts such as LEED Process, Integrative Strategies, LEED credit categories and Project Surroundings and Public Outreach.

- LEED Process (16 questions)
- Integrative Strategies (8 questions)
- Location and Transportation (7 questions)
- Sustainable Sites (7 questions)
- Water Efficiency (9 questions)
- Energy and Atmosphere (10 questions)
- Materials and Resources (9 questions)
- Indoor Environmental Quality (8 questions)
- Project Surroundings and Public Outreach (11 questions)
