Overview

In furtherance of SJC Rule 6.1, Voluntary Pro Bono Publico Service, the Supreme Judicial Court Standing Committee on Pro Bono Legal Services annually presents the Adams Pro Bono Publico Awards to honor Massachusetts lawyers, law students, small and large law firms, government attorney offices, corporate law departments, law schools or other institutions in the legal profession that demonstrate outstanding and exceptional commitment to providing volunteer legal services for the poor and disadvantaged. The 2015 Pro Bono Publico Awards will be presented in a ceremony at the John Adams Courthouse on October 28, 2015, in conjunction with the American Bar Association's recognition of National Pro Bono Week. The Adams Pro Bono Publico Awards are named in honor of Attorneys John Adams and John Quincy Adams.

Award Criteria

Awardees will be selected from those who have excelled in providing volunteer services in one or more of the following ways:

- Participated in an activity or pro bono program which resulted in satisfying previously unmet needs or in extending services to underserved segments of the population;
- Successfully litigated pro bono cases that favorably affected the provision of other services to the poor; and/or
- Successfully achieved legislation that contributed substantially to legal services to the poor.

Nomination Guidelines

- Kindly submit a narrative explaining how the candidate meets the criteria for The Adams Pro Bono Publico Awards. Describe in detail the nature of the pro bono contribution and identify those who have benefited. Additional information that would be helpful includes principal areas of practice, the number of years practicing law, hours spent on pro bono activities, other public service contributions, educational background, and bar association activities.
- Include up to three letters of support from other individuals and organizations who are aware of the candidate's pro bono contribution. If possible, please include one letter from a beneficiary of the pro bono legal services.
- Nominations submitted in 2014 remain active for consideration in the 2015 Awards program, provided that the nominating party submits a letter restating the intent to nominate the candidate and updating the narrative with any relevant information.
- Nominations should be received no later than **Friday, July 3, 2015**. Nominations should clearly identify the name and contact information of the nominating party (telephone number and email); nominations should also include contact information (telephone number and email) for the nominated candidate.
