The Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) held a public meeting regarding the Preliminary Exhibit Design for Mount Greylock State Reservation on September 15, 2011 in Lanesborough.

At this meeting, we were pleased to provide an overview of the Preliminary Exhibit Design and to obtain public input on the locations, materials, and content of the exhibits and outdoor signage and panels. DCR and its consultant, Design Division, will be finalizing the design in October and preparing to solicit proposals for fabrication and installation over the winter. DCR expects the project to be completed in the early summer of 2012.

This project is a direct outcome of the Interpretive Master Plan for Greylock, which is now posted in its final form at <http://www.mass.gov/dcr/parks/mtGreylock/>. The plan and the exhibits are funded through a federal Transportation, Systems and Community Preservation (TCSP) grant, with a 20 percent match provided by the state.
