The Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) is preparing a feasibility and design study to evaluate transportation and multi-use improvements along Agassiz Road based on the current work on the Emerald Necklace Crosswalks and Treatment Guidelines. The study is being carried out with the support of the Fenway Civic Association under DCR's Partnership Matching Funds Program and in cooperation with the City of Boston.


On October 3, 2011, DCR and the Fenway Civic Association hosted a public meeting at the Berklee College of Music. During the meeting, the findings of the field inventory/analysis of existing conditions were presented and conceptual design alternatives, on which public input was sought, were also discussed.
