By the Numbers

- 4 Campgrounds
- 4 pools and 1 wading pool
- 1 ocean beach
- 5 designated freshwater swimming areas
- 1 commercial working dairy farm
- 3 Districts – Atlantic, Great Brook and Metro West



Northeast Region-Staffing

- 12 Year round, staffed facilities
- 47 Year round State Park Staff
 - Down from 56 a year ago
- 200+ Seasonal Employees
- 2 Areas unstaffed for second season
 - Ashland and Berry Pond at Harold Parker



Revenue Collection

- Collect revenue seasonally at Salisbury, Bradley Palmer, Willard Brook, Cochituate and Hopkinton
- Collect Revenue year round via Pay and Display machines at Halibut (new), Maudslay, Great Brook and Walden
