### **DCR HOLDING PUBLIC MEETING TO DISCUSS CONSTRUCTION PLANS FOR THE NEPONSET RIVER ESPLANADE**

**WHAT:** The Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) will hold a public meeting to discuss construction plans and traffic impacts for the rehabilitation of the Neponset River Esplanade.

DCR will provide an update on the Neponset River Esplanade Project, aimed at establishing a 3.5-mile, multi-use pathway system along the Neponset River from Blue Hill Avenue in Mattapan Square to the Martini Shell in Hyde Park. Information about work completed to date, the ongoing project along Truman Highway from Dana Avenue to the Stop & Shop, and future plans to complete the system will be included. DCR will also discuss the rehabilitation of the parkland around the Martini Shell and the land at 7 Brush Hill Road near Mattapan Square.
