## **Patrick-Murray Administration Offering Cross-Country Skiing, Kick Sledding, and Snowshoeing at DCR's Leo J. Martin Memorial Golf Course in Weston**

**WHAT:** The Department of Conservation and Recreation's (DCR) Universal Access Program will offer cross-country skiing, kick sledding and snowshoeing for individuals with disabilities at the Leo J. Martin Memorial Golf Course in January, February and March. IN the event of no snow or ice, hiking, nature walks, and other activities will be offered.

The Universal Access Program (UAP) provides recreational accessibility to state parks for individuals and disabilities, their families and friends. Free use of accessible equipment and staff assistance are available.

UAP strives to increase the participation among persons with disabilities in indoor and outdoor recreational activities in integrated settings. In January, February and March, UAP will offer ice skating, sit-skating, cross-country skiing, sit cross-country skiing, snow shoeing, kick sledding, snowmobiling and other winter activities at Massachusetts state parks. The program also offers accessible cycling, boating, hiking, bird watching and horseback riding in summer and fall.
