### DCR HOLDING PUBLIC MEETING TO DISCUSS JAMAICA POND PEDESTRIAN ACCESS ENHANCEMENTS

**WHAT:** The Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) and the Emerald Necklace Conservancy will hold a second public meeting on Jamaica Pond pedestrian access enhancements at three locations:

- Eliot Street at the Jamaicaway
- Kelley Circle at Parkman Drive
- Parkman Drive at Parkman Memorial

At this meeting, the consultants will present and discuss preferred options that have been developed incorporating public comments received on earlier options.
