A permit allows the holder to use a motor larger than 20 horsepower (25 hp for 4-stroke engines) on Long Pond from Memorial Day through September 30 between the hours of 10 AM and 6 PM. Boats with motors larger than 20 horsepower (25 horsepower for 4-stroke engines) are not allowed on Long Pond with or without a permit before Memorial Day or after September 30, or before 10 AM and after 6 PM.

A total of fifty (50) permits will be issued on a first-come, first-served basis on Wednesday, April 8 beginning at 7:00 AM at the Quabbin Visitor Center at Winsor Dam in Belchertown.

Applicants must have boat registration with them. Only one application per person will be accepted.

Does not apply for boats with motors of 20 horsepower (25 horsepower for 4-stroke engines) or less.
