You are receiving this survey because you have been designated as the contact person for a Massachusetts State Revolving Fund (SRF) - American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) eligible loan. As such, the following survey will be required weekly.

This survey will be collecting information weekly for carrying out the reporting requirements included in Section 1512 of ARRA. The Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MassDEP) in conjunction with the Water Pollution Abatement Trust will compile this data and submit the necessary reports to the Environmental Protection Agency and Recovery.gov. When published on Recovery.gov, these reports will provide the public with an unprecedented level of transparency into how Federal dollars are being spent and will help drive accountability for the timely, prudent, and effective spending of recovery dollars.

Recipient reports required by Section 1512 of the Recovery Act will answer important questions, such as:

- 1) Who is receiving Recovery Act dollars and in what amounts?
- 2) What projects or activities are being funded with Recovery Act dollars?
- 3) What is the completion status of such projects or activities and what impact have they had on job creation and retention?

This survey will be collecting the aggregate of the above information weekly.
