SPECIAL CONDITIONS

1. Erving Paper Mills, Inc., located at 97 East Main Street, Erving, Massachusetts, (the “permittee”) is authorized to discharge pretreated industrial wastewater to the town of Erving sewer system.
2. This Permit expires five (5) years from the date of issuance. The permittee shall apply for a renewal of this Permit at least 90 days prior to the expiration date in accordance with 314 CMR 7.09 (3)(b).
3. This Permit is subject to obtaining approval of any other applicable federal, state or local authority that may have jurisdiction.
4. Industrial wastewater discharged from the site shall be in compliance with the EPA General Pretreatment Regulations for Existing and New Sources of Pollution (40 CFR 403) and the Pulp, Paper, and Paperboard (40 CFR 430) Categorical Pretreatment Standards, the town of Erving Sewer Use Ordinance and Industrial Pretreatment Program (“IPP”), any industrial discharge permit issued by the town of Erving, and the local effluent limitations established therein. The most stringent limitations shall prevail.
5. The permittee shall conduct all sampling and monitoring in accordance with 40 CFR 136.
6. The permittee shall maintain and make available for review all compliance documentation required by any industrial discharge permit issued by the town of Erving.
7. The permittee shall submit an up to date piping and instrumentation diagram (“PID”) for each of its industrial wastewater pretreatment systems to the Massachusetts Board of Certification of Wastewater Treatment Plant Operators (the “Board”) within thirty (30) days from the effective date of this permit.
8. The permittee shall staff each of its industrial wastewater pretreatment systems in accordance with the grade designated by the Board and the staffing requirements contained in 314 CMR 7.05(2)(g)5.
9. The permittee shall dispose of all non-hazardous sludge in accordance with 310 CMR 19.00.
10. Concentrated chemicals and hazardous materials/wastes are prohibited from being discharged to the sewer.
11. No person owning, maintaining or using a sewer connection shall discharge or allow the discharge of wastewater through such connection which would result in a hazard to the public health or safety or a violation of the provisions of 314 CMR 7.00 or 12.00.
