On September 22, 2014, the Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) held a public meeting at the Nantasket Beach Resort to present and obtain feedback on a proposed Master Plan for the Nantasket Beach Reservation.

The Draft Master Plan includes recommendations made by DCR that are aimed at creating a more attractive, greener environment, offering better access to the Beach and Reservation and more amenities for visitors.
