On Wednesday, January 27, 2016, the Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) held a public meeting at the Nantasket Beach Resort in Hull to present a summary of the final draft Master Plan for the Nantasket Beach Reservation. This proposed Master Plan was guided by an extensive public process that included a Citizens Advisory Committee and a series of public meetings held over the last ten years. In particular, it incorporated feedback provided by the community on some key issues raised during and after a public meeting held by DCR on September 22, 2014.

The Master Plan includes recommendations aimed at creating a more attractive, greener environment that offers better access to the Beach and Reservation. The recommendations also aim to offer more amenities for visitors to enjoy in the summer, spring, and fall and to improve traffic flow through the Reservation during peak usage.
