Offering over 3,000 acres of park land, Willowdale/Cleaveland Farm is primarily used for hiking and horseback riding.

It is part of the Massachusetts state park system and is managed by the Massachusetts Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR), an agency of the Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs.

DCR oversees 450,000 acres of parks, forests, beaches, bike trails, watersheds, and dams. Its mission is to protect, promote, and enhance the state's natural, cultural, and recreational resources. 
TRAIL USE GUIDELINES AT WILLOWDALE/ CLEVELAND FARM
