TWO WEEK LOOK-AHEAD **September 12, 2016 – September 25, 2016**

The following activities will be occurring over the next two weeks.

Rumney Marsh, Saugus

- The utility services have been activated and the Resident Engineer's trailer at the Ballard Street parking lot is in use.
- Planting of High Tide Bushes along the toe of slope in Salt Marsh Restoration Area D is ongoing.
- Delivery of topsoil and placement over the slopes adjacent to the proposed walking path will be continuing over the next two weeks. Installation of landscaping and hydroseeding the slopes along the path will resume in late September or early October.
- The environmental monitor will observe conditions of the slopes and erosion control devices.

Winthrop Beach

- Construction activities have been completed for this phase of the project. The next phase of the project, Reconstruction of Winthrop Shore Drive, is planned to begin in the spring of 2017.



Planting installation at Rumney Marsh Area D is concluding with the installation of High Tide Bushes along the perimeter of the salt marsh restoration area.

In preparation for installation of the remaining landscaping, topsoil is being spread over the slopes along the Rumney Marsh walking path.

Design for Phase 4 – Winthrop Shore Drive Improvements

- A meeting is planned for October (date, time and venue TBD) to present the latest design plans for the Winthrop Shore Drive reconstruction project.

Please note that street sweeping has resumed on Winthrop Shore Drive. It occurs every 3rd Thursday of the month. Please remove cars from Shore Drive in advance of street sweeping or else they will be towed.
