Dear Mr. Graczyk:

Pursuant to 310 CMR 76.04(2)(b)(2) the person requesting an alternative method for disposal of individual mercury-added products or mercury-added components shall publish a Legal Notice in a Massachusetts newspaper of general circulation and the Massachusetts Environmental Monitor.

The attached Legal Notice must be printed at your expense in a Massachusetts newspaper of general circulation and the Massachusetts Environmental Monitor and a hard copy of the newspaper clip and an electronic copy of the Public Notice as published in the newspaper must be sent by you to this office **within 5 days of the date of its publication**. The date and the name of the newspaper must also be visible on the image of the newspaper that is sent to MassDEP. The image can be no larger than 20MB in the following file extensions: doc, xml, txt, xsl, jpeg, jpg, rtf, html, gif.

The above Legal Notice may be printed in a newspaper of your choice but it must appear in a newspaper that has general circulation in the area where the alternate disposal facilities are located (Chicopee, Granby and South Hadley).

**You must also file an electronic version of this Legal Notice with the Massachusetts Environmental Policy Act (MEPA) Office for publication in the Environmental Monitor. The Notice must be emailed in .pdf format ONLY to: [barbara.kehoe@state.ma.us](mailto:barbara.kehoe@state.ma.us) or [josephine.wixon@state.ma.us](mailto:josephine.wixon@state.ma.us). The email should include the name, telephone number and email address of a contact person at your company who can respond to questions about your proposal.**

Pursuant to M.G.L. c. 21H, Section 6I, a provision of the “Massachusetts Mercury Management Act”, and per 310 CMR 76.04(2)(b)(2), notice is given of the following Waiver Request and proposed actions thereon:

**CITY/TOWN:** Chicopee, Granby and South Hadley

**PROJECT NAME:** NLR, Inc., Alternative Method of Disposal of Crushed Glass from Spent Fluorescent Lamps

**APPLICANT:** NLR, Inc.

**APPLICANT LOCATION:** 250 Main St., East Windsor, CT 06088

**PURPOSE:** Approval of an alternative method of disposal for an individual mercury-added product and mercury-added component on a case-by-case basis

**PROPOSED ACTION:** MassDEP received a waiver request, pursuant to 310 CMR 76.04(2)(b), for the alternate use of crushed/pulverized glass derived from spent fluorescent, mercury-containing bulbs. The applicant is proposing to ship the crushed/pulverized glass to the Chicopee, Granby and/or South Hadley Landfills to be used as gas-venting material, pipe backfill and alternate daily cover. In addition to this waiver, NLR, Inc. will be required to obtain an approval for a Category 2-Regulated Systems Beneficial Use Determination (BUD), pursuant to 310 CMR 19.00 for the use of said material at the specified landfills.
