





# Demond Pond

# Demond Pond, Rutland

## General Information

Demond Pond is a 122-acre Great Pond located off Pleasantdale Road about one mile south of Route 122A in Rutland. The average depth of Demond Pond is 9 feet with a maximum depth of 27 feet and the water is slightly tannic. The bottom type is mud, although there are some areas of rocky reef and rubble. About half of the shoreline is developed with year round homes and cottages. Cover is provided by boulders and downed trees with some areas of aquatic vegetation.

## Recreational Access

A gravel and dirt boat ramp (42°21'24.20"N 71°58'18.43"W) is located off of Pleasantdale Rd. on the west side of the dam, but is only suitable for light boats, car top boats, and canoes. Parking is limited to the shoulder of Pleasantdale Road near the ramp and shore fishing is limited to areas immediately adjacent to the boat ramp.

## Fish Populations

The following fish species were found during MassWildlife surveys: Largemouth Bass, Chain Pickerel, Yellow Perch, White Perch, Black Crappie, Bluegill, Pumpkinseed, Rock Bass, Brown Bullhead, Golden Shiner, and White Sucker. Demond Pond is also stocked each spring with trout.

## Fishing

Demond Pond offers excellent fishing for Largemouth Bass, many of which are in the 2-4 pound size range, with an occasional 5+ pounder. Trout fishing in spring is also good, however it is unlikely that these fish holdover until fall. Demond Pond has produced Chain Pickerel, Largemouth Bass, Black Crappie, and Yellow Perch that meet minimum sizes for recognition by the Freshwater Sportfishing Awards Program.
