General Information: Dunn Pond is part of a 120 acre park owned and operated by The Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR). No motorized boats are allowed on the pond.

Access: Parking is available for a fee at the DCR visitors center. There is an unimproved canoe access off of Betty Spring Road. A hiking trail around the pond allows for plenty of shore fishing.

Management History: Managed as both a warm and coldwater fishery.

Fish Populations: A summer 2007 survey produced plenty of fish including chain pickerel, black crappie, yellow perch, and hold-over trout. Yellow perch made up the bulk of the sampling catch. Golden shiners were also present as a forage fish.

Fishing: Plenty of panfish and easy access make this a great pond to take a kid fishing at. If you are looking for yellow perch, give Dunn Pond a try. Also, target the deeper holes for holdover brown trout.
