





Pratt Pond

General Information:

Pratt Pond is a shallow, weedy, warmwater pond located in Upton and that drains into the Blackstone River. The bottom is mostly muck with some rubble and sand. Riprap is present along the northeast shore. Aquatic weeds are abundant along much of the shore and shallow coves. Activities include swimming, boating, and fishing.

Recreational Access:

Shore access is very good, primarily on the north and west sides of the pond. Limited parking is available on North Main Street. Parking is also available at Kiwanis Beach Park; fees for non-residents apply in the summer months.

Fish Populations:

Pratt Pond contains both warm and coldwater species. In the most recent sampling efforts, eleven species were collected including Largemouth Bass, Chain Pickerel, Yellow Perch, Black Crappie, Bluegill, Pumpkinseed, and Brown Bullheads. Interestingly, this latest fish sample did not include White Perch, a species present during a prior fish sampling effort.

Fishing:

Pratt Pond offers good fishing for an assortment of warmwater species. The bass population is healthy, with fish ranging from legal size to 20 inches. Bluegills and Pumpkinseeds exhibited above average growth rates with many fish approaching 8 inches. Summer fishing for Bullheads and Black Crappie is excellent. Ice fishing for Chain Pickerel and Yellow Perch should be productive. In addition to the warmwater species, trout are stocked during the spring. Some trout carry over and are regularly taken during the fall and winter. Pratt Pond has produced trophy-sized fish through the Division's Freshwater Sportfishing Award Program, including Black Crappie, Bullhead, Brook Trout, Rainbow Trout, Largemouth Bass, Sunfish, and Yellow Perch.
