General Information: Stuart Pond has also been known as Washington Bond, Ross Mill Pond, and Stump Pond in the past. It is part of a chain of water supplies formerly controlled by the Department of Conservation and Recreation. It is artificial in origin and is open to the public by agreement with the owner. Area: 38 acres with a maximum of 9 feet and an average of 4 feet.

Access: Easily accessible from East Princeton center via Stuart Road and Justice Hill Road Cutoff with cartop access only.

Management History: Managed as a warmwater fishery.

Fish Populations: The pond has not been surveyed in recent years, but has a warmwater base of fish from past surveys such as largemouth bass, chain pickerel, yellow perch, bluegill, pumpkinseeds and yellow bullheads.

Fishing: With the pond having substantial road access it gives youth & adult fisherman plenty of spots to pick for shore fishing.
