## LAKE WARNER (Hadley)

### General Information:

This is a fertile, 68-acre, warm water pond located three miles west of Amherst center. Access off Route 63 is suitable for trailer launching. The lake is shallow and weedy with a mean depth of three feet and a maximum depth of 10 feet. At least fifty percent of the surface area is weed covered and the bottom is muck. The 3.4 miles of shoreline are about ten percent developed. Watercolor is brown and the transparency averages about five feet.

This lake can be located on the U.S.G.S. topographical quad map titled "Mt. Toby." Nearby fishing areas include Puffers Pond and the Sawmill and Connecticut Rivers.

### Fish Populations:

The fish population was sampled on July 7, 1981. The 12 species observed, listed in order of sampling abundance, included yellow perch, largemouth bass, bluegill, white sucker, white perch, chain pickerel, brown bullhead, yellow bullhead, pumpkinseed, black crappie and golden shiners.

### Fishing:

The general fish population appears to be in balance. There is a very good largemouth bass population with good stock density and above average growth rates. Chain pickerel were less numerous, however, displaying growth rates below the state average. There is a very good yellow perch population. These fish average eight inches, but there are a few up to 12 inches.
