

**If we have credits built up over time, can we adjust schedule Z to allocate those existing credits to other accounts? Or does a schedule z adjustment only affect future credits?**

Schedule Z adjustments only affect future credits and excess net metering credits will continue to be rolled forward until the credits are used up. However, if a customer has significant credits built up that will continue to roll over for a significant time we suggest you talk with the distribution company.

**How do you reconcile accounts if the solar developer bill is by calendar month but the utility bills mid-month? kWh differ due to the billing periods.**

You can request that the solar developer explain their billing methodology. Some developers have websites that show solar generation outputs in searchable increments (e.g. hourly, daily, weekly, etc.). If so, as the customer, you should request access to these websites.

**Some suppliers are willing to consolidate their supply charges on the utility bill for a fee which also needs to be factored in if you ask them to do that in order to accommodate the net metering credits. Have you heard of this?**

There is no cost to a supplier to bill a customer through the utility bill. However, a supplier may charge a fee for this service, assuming it adheres to the terms of their contract with a customer. Thus, we suggest you check the terms of your supply agreement prior to signing to understand all fees that may be charged for this or other services.
