A key question concerning coal plants is whether it is wise to replace them with gas fired plants. Given the difference in GHG emissions and other pollutants between coal and gas, and given the presence of electric transmission facilities, it may make sense to use gas as a transition energy source. However, it should be kept in mind that within a couple of decades gas, too, must be phased out. Otherwise the very sites of Massachusetts coal plants may be subject to flooding in the foreseeable future.
