Executive Summary

Bias Motivation

In 2011 prejudice against race/ethnicity or national origin was the most widely reported bias motivation, representing 50.7% of the total, down from 52.9% the year before. Bias against sexual orientation is the second most frequent bias motivation, with 25.7% of the total, down from 26.6% in 2010. Religious bias was third with 20.9%, up from 18.2% the year before. (Please refer to Table 2 in the Appendix: Bias Types Reported to the Police).

The largest category of bias motivations were determined to be anti-Black, with 109 incidents, or 30.4% of all reports. Another 22.6%, or 81 incidents, were classified as anti-Gay. Anti-Semitic and anti-white cases ranked third and fourth, at 17% and 8.9%, respectively. Bias against the Hispanic ethnicity was reported in 5.6% of cases, while bias against Islamic religion or persons from Arab countries was reported in 3.3% of incidents (Please refer to Table 2 in the Appendix: Bias Types Reported to the Police).

Crimes

Bias crimes entail a variety of different criminal offenses, ranging from violent crimes to harassment to vandalism. Of the 598 criminal offenses reported in 2011, the most frequent offense was intimidation (29.9%), followed by general civil rights violations (28.1%), with vandalism and property damage the third most frequently reported offense (17.7%). There were 44 aggravated assaults reported, an increase of 22.2% from the 36 aggravated assaults reported in 2010. (Please refer to Table 1 in the Appendix: Crimes Committed During Bias Attacks).

The reporting system also captures information on the types of weapons used in the commission of the offense. Firearms were not reported as being used in any of the 2011 incidents. The use of knives was reported in 12 cases (8.6% of 2011 incidents), while the use of a blunt object was reported in 14 cases (10.1% of incidents in 2011). In 65 incidents, hands, fists or feet were used (46.8% of incidents); and in another 40 incidents, “other weapon” was used (28.8% of 2011 incidents). Victims and Offenders

Echoing previous years, males were still the most frequent victims (64.4% in 2011) and offenders (76.2%) of hate crimes. Females were victims in 34.9% of incidents. Females as a percentage of offenders were 23.8% in 2011. (For a breakdown of victim and offender gender, please refer to Tables 15 and 17.) Whites were also the most frequent racial category as victims (48.5%, down from 54.0% in 2010), and also as offenders (41.8%, down from 66.5% the previous year). Black victims of both genders composed 20.2% of the total victim population, down from 35.9% the previous year. (Please see Table 3 in the Appendix: Crimes by Primary Victims' Race).

Victims were reported to have some type of injury in 19.8% of cases, up from 17.1% of cases in 2010. (Please refer to Table 18 in the Appendix: Injury Types.)

Location

Bias incidents reported by police in Massachusetts occur in a variety of locations, both public and private. In 2011, 32.2% of incidents occurred in a residence, up from 29.2% in 2010. An additional 25.5% occurred on a highway or street, up from 21.9% in 2010. The third most frequent location was schools and colleges at 10.7%, down from 16.1% in 2010, while another 9.6% of incidents occurred at unknown locations, up from 7% in 2010. Targets

Individuals (which includes private property), were primarily the targets for bias crimes in the Commonwealth, with 87.9% of the reports, up from 84.8% the previous year. As in 2010, businesses were the second most-frequent target in 2011 with 5% of the reports, down from 6.7% the year before. Police cited government facilities, in 2.4% of the incidents, as the third most frequently targeted location, down from 3.2% the previous year. Notes on Data

The 2011 Hate Crime report for Massachusetts was compiled using data voluntarily supplied from police departments across the Commonwealth. The Commonwealth Fusion Center's Crime Reporting Unit received a total of 345 reports of incidents of hate crime (up from 329 in 2010, an increase of 4.9%) from 64 municipal police departments, Transit Police, and 11 campus police agencies. An additional 243 municipal police departments, 28 campus police agencies, Environmental Police, the State Police, and a specialized agency reported zero hate crimes during 2011. The 345 incidents encompassed 358 bias types and 598 criminal charges (up from 533 in 2010, an increase of 12.2%). After receipt and state data quality check, the CRU submits all Massachusetts hate crime data to the FBI for further analysis and inclusion in their annual *Hate Crime Statistics* publication.

Hate crimes are reported as 'incidents.' Many of these reports have multiple victims, offenders, offenses, and bias motivations. In addition, some reports are submitted with missing data. As a result of these issues, the totals in the following tables may not be the same.

Definitions

- Hate Crime*** Any criminal act to which a bias motive is evident as a contributing factor. The Reporting Act covers bias on account of race, religion, ethnicity, handicap, gender, or sexual orientation. Hate crimes can be reported only by law enforcement agencies.
- Zero Report*** An official report by a police department stating no hate crimes were reported to the department during the reporting period.
- Non-reporting agencies*** Local police departments, and other law enforcement agencies, which are not in compliance with the provisions of the Reporting Act. These agencies failed to indicate how many, if any, bias crimes occurred in their jurisdiction.
- Reporting agencies*** Local police departments, as well as other law enforcement agencies, who have voluntarily reported the incidence of identified bias crimes in their jurisdiction. Agencies can comply with the Reporting Act by reporting the number of bias crimes, even if zero. Participating agencies which reported zero hate crimes for 2011 are listed separately.


Reports by Law Enforcement Agencies

Hate crimes were reported by 64 local police departments, Transit Police and 11 campus police agencies. The local police departments reporting represent a total population of 2,933,722. A total of 345 hate crime reports were filed by these agencies, which included 598 criminal offenses and 358 reported bias motivations. An additional 243 municipal police departments, 28 campus police agencies, environmental police, the State Police, and a specialized agency submitted Zero Reports for 2011. These municipalities represented a total population of 3,531,741. Forty-six municipal agencies and nine campus police departments did not participate in the hate crime reporting program. These agencies had a total population of 82,166.

In the statistics that follow, it should be noted that a single incident report may include multiple offenses, bias motivations, victims or offenders. As a result, totals in some categories may exceed the number of reports. Similarly, some reports omit information in certain categories, resulting in totals lower than the number of incident reports collected.


Categories of Bias Reported

Bias motivations break down as follows: of the 358 bias motivations for particular incidents reported, race/ethnicity/national origin bias constituted the largest category of reported motives, with 50.7% of the total (down from 52.9% in 2010 and from 56.4% in 2009). Offenses motivated by sexual orientation bias were the second most frequent category, with 25.7% of the total (down from 26.6% in 2010 and from 24.5% in 2009). Offenses related to religious affiliation were the third most prevalent, with 20.9%, up from 18.2% in 2010, while anti-female offenses were 1.1% of the total (down from 2.2% in 2010); physical handicap was also 1.1% of the total (up from 0.3% in 2010), and against AIDS status were 0.3% of the total (not reported in 2010).



Categories of Crimes Reported

Of the 598 total crimes reported, Harassment / Threats were the most frequently reported offense, representing 29.9% of the total (up from 28.7% in 2010). For the second year in a row, General Civil Rights Violations were the second most frequently reported offense, with 28.1% (up from 27.6% in 2010). Vandalism / Damage to Property were the third most frequently reported offenses, representing 17.7% (down from 20.1% in 2010). Other frequently reported offenses were Simple Assault (11.2%, up from 10.7% in 2010) and Aggravated Assault (7.4%, up from 6.8% in 2010).




Victim and Offender Profile


Of the cases with valid information, a “Person” (including private property) was the target in 87.9% of cases (up from 84.8% in 2010). For the second year in a row, “Businesses” were the second most frequently targeted group, with 5% of the incidents (down from 6.7% in 2010). “Governmental targets” were the third most frequently targeted group with 2.4% (down from 3.2% in 2010). The fourth most frequently targeted group were “Religious Institutions (1.5%); followed by “Society” and “Other Targets”, both at 1.2% each. The sixth most frequently targeted were “Unknown Targets” at 0.6%.


In incidents where the victim’s race was reported, whites were victims 48.5% of the time (down from 54.0% in 2010) while blacks were victims in 38.1% of cases (up from 35.9% in 2010). The victims were male in 64.4% of cases (up from 55.7% in 2010). As in 2010, in the cases where the victim(s)’s age group was identified, the most frequently reported age group was 16-20 years of age.


The perpetrator(s) of hate crimes were white in 41.8% of cases (down from 66.5% in 2010), and black in 20.2% of cases (down from 28.3% in 2010), in the 282 cases where this information was identified. The perpetrator was male in 76.2% of cases (up from 75.6% in 2010), and of the cases where the offender(s)’s age group was identified, the most frequently reported age group was 16-20 years of age, the same as for the victims.

Characteristics of the Incidents

The majority of incidents occurred in residences (32.2%, up from 29.2% in 2010); followed by highways or streets (25.5%, up from 21.9% in 2010). Other locations where incidents occurred, in descending order, were schools/colleges (10.7%, down from 16.1% in 2010); unknown locations (9.6%, up from 7.0% in 2010); commercial office buildings (3.2%, up from 2.7% in 2010); parking lots/garages (2.3%, down from 4.3% in 2010), and the categories of field/woods and church/synagogue/temples were both tied at 2.0% each.

Weapons of some type were used in 139 incidents. In cases where the type of weapon was identified, hands/fist/feet were used the most frequently (46.8% of cases, down from 49.1% of cases in 2010), “Other weapons” were listed in 28.8% (down from 30.9% in 2010); blunt objects were used in 10.1% of cases, and knives were used in 8.6% of cases (up from 6.4% of cases in 2010).

Of the 232 incidents in which injury information was submitted, no visible injuries were reported in 186 (80.2%) of the incidents. Other minor injuries were reported in 27 incidents (11.6%); two incidents of possible internal injuries (0.9%); and nine incidents of severe lacerations (3.9%) were reported.
