


Massachusetts Hate Crimes, 2010

Executive Summary

The 2010 Hate Crime report for Massachusetts was compiled using data voluntarily supplied from police departments across the Commonwealth. The Commonwealth Fusion Center's Crime Reporting Unit received a total of 329 reports of incidents of hate crime (up from 314 in 2009, an increase of 4.7%) from 69 municipal police departments, Transit Police, and 12 campus police agencies. An additional 230 municipal police departments, 19 campus police agencies, the State Police, and a specialized agency reported zero hate crimes during 2010. The 329 incidents encompassed 533 criminal charges (up from 522 in 2009, an increase of 2.10%).

A "hate crime" is defined as a criminal act in which bias against race, religion, ethnicity, handicap, gender, or sexual orientation is recognized as a contributing factor. Accordingly, hate crime reporting does not capture incidents of bias that do not amount to crimes. Similarly, if a crime is motivated by bias, but the bias indicator is not reported by the victim or noted by the investigating police department, it will not be reported.

In 2010 prejudice against race/ethnicity or national origin was the most widely reported bias motivation, representing 52.9% of the total, down from 56.4% the year before, a decrease of 6.6%. Bias against sexual orientation is second, with 26.6% of the total, up from 24.5% in 2009, an increase of 8.7%. Religious bias was third with 18.2%, up from 17.0% the year before, an increase of 7%. (Please refer to Table 2 in the Appendix). Notably, bias against the Islamic religion and persons from Arab countries increased 22.9% from the previous year (4.4% in 2010 vs. 3.5% in 2009).

For the third year in a row, the female gender rose as a percentage of the victims of hate crimes, from 37.4% in 2008, to 36.5% in 2009, to 44.3% in 2010. Females as a percentage of offenders went from 21.1% in 2008, to 18.15% in 2009, to 24.4% in 2010. (For a breakdown of victim and offender gender, please refer to Tables 15 and 17.) Echoing previous years, males were still the most frequent victims (55.7% in 2010) and offenders (75.6%) of hate crimes. Whites were also the most frequent racial category as victims (54.0%, down from 59.5% in 2009, a decrease of 10.0%) and also as offenders (66.5%, down from 68.5% the previous year, a decrease of 3.0%). Black victims of both genders composed 35.9% of the total population of victims, up from 29.7% the previous year, for an increase of 20.8%. (For a breakdown of bias types by primary victim's race, see Table 3.)

Victims were reported to have some type of injury in 17.1% of cases, down from 20.8% of cases in 2009, a decrease of 21.4%. Police officers investigating these incidents reported there were no visible injuries to the victim in 83.0% of the cases. (Please refer to Table 18 for a breakdown by injuries.)

Bias incidents reported by police in Massachusetts occur in a variety of locations, both public and private. In 2010, 29.2% of incidents occurred in a residence, down from over one-third, 34.2%, in 2009, a decrease of 17.1%. An additional 21.9% occurred on a highway or street, down from 23% in 2009, a decrease of 5.0%. The third most frequent location were schools and colleges at 16.1%, up from 10.5% in 2009, an increase of 52.7%, while another 7% of incidents occurred at unknown locations, up from 5.4% in 2009, an increase of 28.9%. (See Table 12 for a breakdown of locations.)

Hate crimes in 2010 focused on specific victims rather than religious, ethnic or government symbols. Individuals (which includes private property), were primarily the targets for bias crimes in the commonwealth, with 84.8% of the reports, up from 79.7% the previous year, an increase of 6.4%. Unlike 2008 and 2009, where "Other Targets" were the second most frequent targets, Businesses were second in 2010 with 6.7% of the reports (prior to 2008, Private Property was second). Police cited government facilities as the third most frequently targeted, in 3.2% of the incidents. (Please refer to Table 11.)

Specific types of bias motivations were reported to police departments as well. The largest category of bias incidents were determined to be anti-black, with 30.7% of all incidents, or 112 of the incidents reported. Another 21.4%, or 78 incidents, were classified as anti-gay. Anti-Semitic and anti-white cases ranked third and fourth, at 13.2% and 9.3% respectively, in frequency of occurrence. Discrimination against the Islamic religion or persons from Arab countries was reported in 4.4% of cases, an increase of 22.91% from 2009. (Please refer to Table 2.)

Bias crimes entail a variety of different criminal offenses ranging from violent crimes to vandalism and harassment. Of the 533 criminal offenses reported in 2010, the significant portion involved intimidation (28.7%), followed by general civil rights violations (27.6%), with vandalism and property damage the third most frequently reported offense (20.1%). There were 36 aggravated assaults reported, an increase of 20% from the 30 aggravated assaults reported in 2009 (although closely aligned with the 35 aggravated assaults reported in 2008). (Please refer to Table 1 for a breakdown of criminal offenses).

The reporting system also captures information on the types of weapons used in the commission of the offense. Firearms were used in only 1 case, accounting for less than 1% of the incidents. The use of knives was reported in 7 cases, as was the use of a blunt object, or 6.4% each of incidents in 2010. In 54 incidents, hands, fists or feet were used (49.1% of the incidents). (See Table 13 for breakdown by weapon.)

Definitions

Hate Crime

Any criminal act to which a bias motive is evident as a contributing factor. The Reporting Act covers bias on account of race, religion, ethnicity, handicap, gender, or sexual orientation. Hate crimes can be reported only by law enforcement agencies.

Zero Report

An official report by a police department stating that no hate crimes were reported to the department during the reporting period.

Non-reporting agencies

Local police departments and other law enforcement agencies which are not in compliance with the reporting provisions of the Reporting Act. These agencies have failed to indicate how many, if any, bias crimes occurred in their jurisdiction.

Reporting agencies

Local police departments and other law enforcement agencies which have voluntarily reported the incidence of identified bias crimes in their jurisdiction. Agencies can comply with the Reporting Act by reporting the number of bias crimes, even if zero. Participating agencies which reported zero hate crimes for 2009 are separately listed.


Reports by Law Enforcement Agencies

Hate crimes were reported by 69 local police departments, Transit Police and 12 campus police agencies. The local police departments reporting represented a total population of 3,051,354. A total of 329 hate crime reports were filed by these agencies, which included 533 criminal offenses and 365 reported bias motivations. An additional 230 municipal police departments, 19 campus police agencies, the State Police, and a specialized agency submitted Zero Reports for 2010. These municipalities represented a total population of 3,387,679. Fifty-two municipal police agencies and fifteen campus police departments did not participate in the hate crime reporting program. These agencies had a total population of 108596.

It should be noted in the statistics that follow that a single incident report may include multiple offenses, bias motivations, victims or offenders. As a result, totals in some categories may exceed the number of reports. Similarly, some reports omit information in certain categories, resulting in totals lower than the number of incident reports collected.


Categories of Bias Reported

Bias motivations break down as follows: of the 365 bias motivations for particular incidents reported, race/ethnicity/national origin bias constituted the largest category of reported motives, with 52.9% of the total (down from 56.4% in 2009 and from 57.7% in 2008). Offenses motivated by sexual orientation bias were the second most frequent category, with 26.6% of the total (up from 24.5% in 2009 and from 22.1% in 2008). Offenses related to religious affiliation were the third most prevalent, with 18.2%, while anti-female offenses were reported as 2.2%, and against mental or physical handicap status were 0.3% of the total.



Categories of Crimes Reported

Of the total of 533 crimes reported, harassment and threats were the most frequent offenses, representing 28.7% (down from 36.2% in 2009, a decrease of 20.7%) of the total. In what may be the first time, General Civil Rights Violations were the second most frequent offense, with 27.6% of the total. Vandalism and damage to property were the third most frequent offenses, representing 20.1% of the total. Other frequent crime categories were simple assault (10.7%) and aggravated assault (6.8%, up from 5.8% in 2009, an increase of 18.3%).




Victim and Offender Profile


Of the cases with valid information, a person (including private property) was the target in 84.8% of cases (up from 79.7% in 2009). For the first time, Businesses were the second most frequently targeted group, with 6.7% of the incidents, followed by Government with 3.2%. The fourth most targeted group was "Society", and fifth were religious facilities (3.3%). Discontinuing the trend of the previous two years, when "Other" was the second most frequent target (and in years prior to that, schools/colleges were the second most frequently targeted); in 2010 "Other" was the least most targeted group, coming in sixth.

The victim(s) of hate crimes (in incidents where the victim's race was reported) were white in 54.0% (down from 59.5% in 2009, a decrease of 9.2%) of cases, black in 35.9% of cases (up from 29.7% in 2009, an increase of 20.8%) of cases. The victims were male in 55.7% of cases (down from 63.5%, a decrease of 12.2%). Of the cases where the victim(s)'s age group was available, the most frequently reported age group was 16-20 years of age, a change from 2009 when the most frequently targeted age group was 21-25 years of age.


The perpetrator(s) of hate crimes were white in 66.5% (down from 68.5% in 2009, a decrease of 2.9%) of cases, and black in 28.3% (up from 24.8% in 2009, an increase of 14.2%) of cases, in the 212 cases where this information was available. The perpetrator was male in 75.6% (down from 81.9% in 2009) of cases, and of the cases where the offender(s)'s age group was reported, the most frequently reported age group was 16-20 years of age, the same as for the victims.




Victim and Offender Race

Characteristics of the Incidents

The majority of incidents occurred in residences (29.2%, down from 34.2% in 2009, a decrease of 14.6%) followed by highways or streets (21.9%, down from 23% in 2009, a decrease of 4.8%). Other locations where incidents occurred, in descending order, were schools/colleges (16.1%, up from 10.5% in 2009, an increase of 52.8%), other (7.0%, up from 5.4% in 2009, an increase of 28.9%), parking lot/garages (4.3%), and commercial office buildings and restaurants (both tied at 2.7% each).

Weapons of some type were used in 110 incidents. In cases where the type of weapon was identified, hands/fist/feet were used the most frequently (49.1% of cases, up from 28.6% in 2009, an increase of 71.9%). "Other weapons" were listed in 30.9%, and knives were used in 6.4% of cases, up from 4.08% in 2009, an increase of 56.9%.

Of the 235 incidents in which injury information was submitted, no visible injuries were reported in 195 (fully 83%) of the incidents. Other minor injuries were reported in 34 incidents (14.5%), and one incident of possible internal injuries (0.4%) and two incidents of severe lacerations (0.9%) were reported.
