


# The Commonwealth of Massachusetts



## A Proclamation

Whereas The Commonwealth's experience with, and susceptibility to severe weather and natural hazards such as floods, blizzards, hurricanes, and tornadoes, compounded by the continued risk of potential terrorist attacks, pandemics, and other hazards, both natural and man-made, demonstrates the ongoing need for Massachusetts to prepare for a broad range of emergencies; and

Whereas The Executive Office of Public Safety and Security, which includes the Massachusetts Emergency Management Agency, the Massachusetts State Police, the Department of Fire Services, the Department of Public Safety and the Massachusetts National Guard, the Executive Office of Health and Human Services, including the Department of Public Health, have the responsibility to protect safety, minimize the loss of life and property, and protect public health by preparing for, responding to and recovering from disasters or emergencies; and

Whereas The Massachusetts Emergency Management Agency, the Department of Public Health, and other public safety partners are promoting personal, family and community preparedness in the month of September to build resilience, help reduce casualties, and minimize the economic impacts of disasters in our communities and in our state; and

Whereas Emergency preparedness is the responsibility of every resident of the Commonwealth, families and individuals are urged to make preparedness a priority by following four simple steps: build a kit, make a plan, be informed, and get involved; and

Whereas All residents of the Commonwealth are encouraged to participate in preparedness activities and asked to use the preparedness resources at [www.mass.gov/ready](http://www.mass.gov/ready),

Now, Therefore, I, Charles D. Baker, Governor of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, do hereby proclaim the month of September 2016, to be,
