## INSTRUCTIONS FOR DISCLOSURE AS REQUIRED BY § 20(f)

## PART-TIME, CALL OR VOLUNTEER SERVICES TO A POLICE, FIRE, RESCUE OR AMBULANCE DEPARTMENT

## WHEN TO USE THE § 20(f) DISCLOSURE FORM

You are a **municipal employee** and you seek an exemption under **G.L. c. 268A**, § **20(f)** so you can be compensated for **providing personal services in a part-time**, **call or volunteer capacity with the police**, **fire**, **rescue or ambulance department** in your **city**, **town or fire district**. If you will provide these services to a city, you can be eligible for a § 20(f) exemption only if the **city has a population of fewer than thirty-five thousand inhabitants**.

## FILING THE § 20(f) DISCLOSURE

- 1. In the disclosure, enter information about your **municipal employee position** at the top of the form.
- 2. Next, enter information about the **police, fire, rescue or ambulance department** that you serve.
- 3. If you serve a police, fire, rescue or ambulance department in a City, certify that the City has fewer than 35,000 inhabitants as determined by the most recent United States census.
- 4. Indicate whether you will provide services on a part-time, call or volunteer basis.
- 5. Describe the services you will provide to the police, fire, rescue or ambulance department.
- 6. The **head of the agency** that will pay you to provide part-time, call or volunteer services must make a **written certification** that no employee of the agency is available to perform such services as part of his regular duties.
- 7. The city council, board of selectmen, board of aldermen or district prudential committee must approve the exemption.
- 8. File the disclosure with the clerk of the city, town or fire district.
