AN ACT RELATIVE TO ELECTION OFFICERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 54 Section 11 of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by striking the words “one warden, one deputy
3 warden, one clerk, one deputy clerk, four inspectors and four deputy
4 inspectors” and replacing it with “one warden, one clerk, at least two
5 inspectors and a ballot box inspector.”

1 SECTION 2. Chapter 54 Section 12 of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by striking the words “one warden, one deputy
3 warden, one clerk, one deputy clerk, two inspectors and two deputy
4 inspectors” and replacing it with “one warden, one clerk, at least two
5 inspectors and a ballot box inspector.”
