By Mr. Miceli of Wilmington, petition of James R. Miceli for legislation to prohibit the disposal of contaminated soil within the boundaries of water supply zones. Environment, Natural Resources and Agriculture.

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand and Seven.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE PROTECTION OF PUBLIC WATER SUPPLY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 150A of Chapter 111 of the General Laws, as appearing  
2 in the 2004 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the  
3 first sentence the following definition:—  
4 “Contaminated soil”, soil that contains oil or hazardous materials  
5 as a result of a release to the environment.

1 SECTION 2. Section 150A of Chapter 111 is hereby amended by  
2 inserting at the end of the section, the following paragraph:—  
3 Contaminated soil is prohibited from being disposed of, stored,  
4 stockpiled, used as landfill cover, or used as fill material for any and  
5 all purposes within the boundaries of the zone of contribution of any  
6 public or private groundwater drinking water supply or of the water-  
7 shed of any surface drinking water supply.
