AN ACT RELATIVE TO FURNISHING FALSE NAME, SOCIAL SECURITY OR ADDRESS TO A POLICE OFFICER WHEN STOPPED OR DETAINED.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 34A of Chapter 268 of the General Laws, as appearing in  
2 the 2004 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in lines  
3 2 and 3, the words “to a law enforcement officer or law enforcement  
4 official following an arrest” and inserting in place thereof the  
5 following words: , or address, to a police officer when stopped or  
6 detained for a violation of a general law, statute, ordinance, by-law  
7 or rule or regulation, can be arrested and.
