AN ACT TO REMOVE AN INCONSISTENCY IN CERTAIN LAWS CONCERNING ATTACHMENT OF GOODS, EFFECTS AND CREDITS IN THE HANDS OF A PERSON ADJUDGED A TRUSTEE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 246 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking
- 2 out section 40, appearing in the 2004 Official Edition, and inserting
- 3 in place thereof the following section:—
- 4 SECTION 40. If the goods, effects and credits in the hands of a
- 5 person adjudged a trustee are not demanded of him by force of the
- 6 trustee execution within thirty days after the date which appears on
- 7 the trustee execution, they shall be liable to another attachment,
- 8 whether made before or after said date; or if there has been no such
- 9 second attachment, they may be recovered by the defendant.
