AN ACT RELATIVE TO EXEMPTING SUMMER CAMPS FROM THE STATE  
MINIMUM WAGE LAWS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 1A of Chapter 151 of the General Laws, as  
2 appearing in the 2004 Official Edition, is hereby amended, in line  
3 59, by striking out the following words:— operated by a non-profit  
4 charitable corporation.

1 SECTION 2. Section 2 of said Chapter 151, as so appearing, is  
2 hereby amended by striking out, in lines 29 and 30, the words “or  
3 work by members of religious orders” and inserting in place thereof  
4 the following:— work by members of religious orders, or for-profit  
5 and not-for-profit summer camps.
