

# HOUSE . . . . . No. 2330

By Mr. Kennedy of Brockton, petition of Thomas P. Kennedy relative to requiring certain officials to be trained in cardiopulmonary resuscitation. Public Safety and Homeland Security.

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand and Seven.

AN ACT REQUIRING CERTAIN OFFICIALS TO BE TRAINED IN CARDIOPULMONARY RESUSCITATION.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 142 of the General Laws is hereby amended  
2 by inserting after Section 11A the following section:—  
3 Section 11B. Any person appointed inspector of plumbing or  
4 inspector of gasfitting under Sections 11 and 11A shall be trained to  
5 administer cardiopulmonary resuscitation. The training shall not be  
6 less than the standards established by the Committee on Cardiopul-  
7 monary Resuscitation and Emergency Cardiac Care of the American  
8 Heart Association, and shall be satisfactorily completed by them as  
9 soon as practical but in no event more than one year after the date of  
10 their appointment.

1 SECTION 2. Section 3 of Chapter 143 of the General Laws, as  
2 appearing in the 1998 Official Edition is hereby amended by adding  
3 the following paragraph:—  
4 Any person appointed hereunder shall be trained to administer  
5 cardiopulmonary resuscitation. The training shall not be less than the  
6 standards established by the Committee on Cardiopulmonary Resus-  
7 citation and Emergency Cardiac Care of the American Heart Associ-  
8 ation, and shall be satisfactorily completed by them as soon as  
9 practical, but in no event more than one year after the date of their  
10 appointment.

1 SECTION 3. Section 32 of Chapter 166 of the General Laws, as  
2 so appearing, is hereby amended by adding the following para-  
3 graph:—

4 Any person appointed hereunder shall be trained to administer  
5 cardiopulmonary resuscitation. The training shall not be less than the  
6 standards established by the Committee on Cardiopulmonary Resus-  
7 citation and Emergency Cardiac Care of the American Heart Associ-  
8 ation, and shall be satisfactorily completed by them as soon as  
9 practical, but in no event more than one year after the date of their  
10 appointment.
