AN ACT TO EXEMPT CERTAIN VETERANS FROM THE STATE TAX.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Subparagraph (4) of paragraph (2) of subsection B
2 of Section three of Chapter sixty-two of the General Laws, as
3 appearing in the 1994 Official Edition, is hereby amended by
4 striking out subparagraph (4) and inserting in place thereof the
5 following section:—
6 (4) All sums deducted from wages as contributions to an annuity,
7 pension, endowment or retirement fund of the United States govern-
8 ment, the Commonwealth or any political subdivision thereof, and
9 any income from any contributory annuity, pension, endowment or
10 retirement fund of the United States government, the Common-
11 wealth, or any political subdivision thereof, or any other income
12 from a contributory annuity, pension, endowment or retirement fund
13 of any other state or any political subdivision thereof, provided that
14 income from any such similar fund established under the laws of the
15 Commonwealth is not subject to taxation in such other state or polit-
16 ical subdivision, or any income from any retirement allowance
17 payable under Section 58 of Chapter 32 of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall be effective for taxable years begin-
2 ning January first, 2007.
