Callahan relative to the revocation of licenses for physicians convicted of certain felonies, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1157) of Ronald Mariano relative to providing for review of proposed changes to health care provider mandates by the Division of Health Care Finance and Policy, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1159) of Vincent A. Pedone for legislation to extend patient protections to recipients of MassHealth, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1163) of Tom Sannicandro relative to the purchase of prescription drugs from Canada, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 4038) ought to be adopted.

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1     *Ordered,* That the committee on Health Care Financing be  
2 authorized to sit during the recess of the General Court to make an  
3 investigation and study of House document 1122, relative to the  
4 discipline of physicians, House document number 1157, relative  
5 to providing for review of proposed changes to health care  
6 provider mandates by the division of health care financing and  
7 policy, House document number 1159, to extend patient protec-  
8 tions to recipients for Mass-Health, and House document number  
9 1163, relative to prescription drugs.

10     Said committee shall report to the General Court the results of  
11 its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any,  
12 together with any draft of legislation necessary to carry such rec-  
13 ommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the  
14 House of Representatives on or before December 31, 2008.
