

HOUSE No. 4218

By Representative Bradley of Hingham and Senator Hedlund, joint petition of Garrett J. Bradley and Robert L. Hedlund (by vote of the town) for legislation to prohibit certain elected public officials in the town of Hull from receiving retirement and health benefits. Public Service. [Local Approval Received.]

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT AND HEALTH BENEFITS OF CERTAIN ELECTED OFFICIALS OF THE TOWN OF HULL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding chapters 32 and 32B of the
2 General Laws or any other general or special law to the contrary, any
3 elected official of the town of Hull who receives regular annual
4 compensation from the town that is less than \$10,000 annually,
5 adjusted annually according to changes in the United States
6 Consumer Price Index as reported by the Bureau of Labor Statistics
7 as of June 30, shall not be eligible for the benefits provided under
8 said chapters 32 and 32B by virtue of receiving said compensation.

1 SECTION 2. Section 1 shall not impair the retirement or health
2 benefits of any person serving as an elected official in the town of
3 Hull as of January 1, 2008, provided, however, if said elected
4 official fails of nomination or re-election and is subsequently elected
5 following such failure said elected official shall be subject to this
6 act.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
