

SENATE NO. 920

AN ACT RELATIVE TO DISCRIMINATION AGAINST MOTORCYCLE OPERATORS

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled,
And by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, it shall be unlawful for
2 a facility open to the public to refuse service to a person based on that person's means of
3 transportation by motorcycle, the wearing of a helmet, motorcycle insignia or jacket, or having a
4 tattoo.

5 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, it shall be unlawful
6 for a public or private employer to refuse employment to a person based on that person's use of
7 a motorcycle, wearing of a helmet, motorcycle insignia or jacket or having a tattoo.

8 SECTION3. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, it shall be unlawful
9 for a landlord to refuse to rent to a person based on that person's use of a motorcycle, wearing
10 of a helmet, motorcycle insignia or jacket or having a tattoo.

11 SECTION 4. A person aggrieved by a violation of section 1, 2 or 3 shall have a cause of action
12 in a district or superior court for damages, including punitive damages, attorney fees and court
13 costs.
