

SENATE NO. 1469

AN ACT AUTHORIZING TIMOTHY S. ROGERS, AN EMPLOYEE OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS, TO BECOME A MEMBER OF THE STATE RETIREMENT SYSTEM

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled,
And by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any special or general law, rule or regulation to the contrary, the state
2 board of retirement is authorized to admit Timothy S. Rogers, an employee of the Commonwealth of
3 Massachusetts as a member of said retirement system beginning on the date of his employment with
4 the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. As a condition of his enrollment in the state retirement system,
5 Timothy S. Rogers shall be required to pay an amount into the annuity savings fund of the state
6 retirement system, an amount equal to that he would have contributed as if he had been a member in
7 service in said retirement system together with regular interest thereon as of the date of his
8 commencement of his employment with the Commonwealth. In addition, notwithstanding any special
9 or general law, rule or regulation to the contrary, the Hampden County retirement board is authorized
10 to transfer said Timothy S. Rogers' annuity savings fund and creditable service earned as a firefighter
11 with the Town of Wilbraham to the state retirement board, but in no event shall any creditable service
12 be granted for the period of time said Timothy S. Rogers collected a disability retirement from the

13 Hampden County retirement board. This transfer shall occur after Timothy S. Rogers becomes a
14 member of the state retirement system and only in the event that Timothy S. Rogers repays to the
15 Hampden County retirement system all annuity payments he received while on disability retirement
16 from the Hampden County retirement system together with regular interest thereon. The transfer of
17 said annuity savings fund and creditable service shall terminate all rights to benefits of Timothy S.
18 Rogers in the Hampden County retirement system, including but not limited to, his right to
19 reinstatement of his accidental disability retirement benefits.
