AN ACT RELATING TO THE TREATMENT OF ELEPHANTS

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled,
And by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 272 of the General Laws, is hereby amended by inserting after section
2 77B the following section: -
- 3 Section 77C. (a) As used in this section, the following terms shall have the following meanings:
- 4 "Circus" , a class C licensee under the Animal Welfare Act, 7 U. S. C. section 2131 et seq. , and
5 its subsequent amendments, regulations and standards adopted pursuant to the Act, that offers a
6 performance by a live animal, clown or acrobat.
- 7 "Person" , an individual, partnership, corporation, joint venture, association, trust, estate or any
8 other legal entity, and any officer, member, shareholder, director, employee, agent or
9 representative thereof.
- 10 "Traveling show", circus, public show, trade show, photographic opportunity, carnival, city or
11 county fair, agricultural fair, ride, parade, race, performance or a similar undertaking in which

12 elephants do not permanently reside or that moves the elephants from location to location, but
13 not including the transportation of elephants for the purpose of obtaining required medical
14 services for an elephant or for the exchange of an elephant between sanctuaries.

15 (b) It shall be unlawful for any person who houses, possesses, is in contact with, or travels with
16 any elephant kept at a stationary facility or utilized in a circus or traveling show within
17 Massachusetts to engage in any of the following:

18 (1) Use of any implement on an elephant that may reasonably result in harm to the elephant
19 including, but not limited to, the damage, scarring or breakage of an elephant's skin.

20 Any such implement or device that is used, purchased, contrived for or constructed for
21 the purpose of poking, striking, hitting, stabbing, piercing, pinching or other physical
22 contact of an elephant shall be construed as an implement or device which may
23 reasonably result in harm, damage, scarring or breakage of skin to an elephant. For
24 purposes of this subsection such implement or device includes, but is not limited to, a
25 bullhook, ankus or other similar device.

26 (2) Possession of any implement or device that may reasonably result in harm, damage,
27 scarring or breakage of skin to an elephant. Any such implement or device that is used,
28 purchased, contrived for or constructed for the purpose of poking, striking, hitting,
29 stabbing, piercing, pinching or other physical contact of an elephant shall be construed
30 as an implement or device which may reasonably result in harm, damage, scarring or
31 breakage of skin to an elephant. For purposes of this subsection such implement or
32 device includes, but is not limited to, a bullhook, ankus, or other similar device.

33 (3) Use of a chain or similar device to restrain an elephant, except if utilized for the shortest
34 amount of time necessary to provide actual medical treatment.

35 (c) Whoever violates this section shall be fined not more than \$5000 per violation or imprisoned
36 in the house of correction for not more than 1 year, or by both such fine and imprisonment. This
37 section shall not apply to an institution accredited by the American Zoo and Aquarium
38 Association, the Southwick's Zoo, the Forest Park Zoo, and the Big E in West Springfield.
