While the state unemployment rate is 4.7 percent, African Americans, Hispanics/Latinos, Persons with Disabilities, Native Americans, and recently-returned Veterans, continue to experience high unemployment rates, ranging from 7 to 12 percent.

Earlier this year, Governor Charlie Baker created a task force to look at the reasons for the higher unemployment rates among these groups, and find ways to solve the problem.

Labor and Workforce Development Secretary, Ronald L. Walker, II is leading the task force to improve economic opportunities for these populations, and will advise the Governor.
