Catherine C. Ziehl is currently employed as General Counsel, Massachusetts Commission Against Discrimination, serving in this position since mid-October, 2008. Prior to this, she was employed by the Office of the Attorney General from November 1992 to August 2007. She was appointed Chief of the Civil Rights and Civil Liberties Division, Public Protection Bureau, and served in that position from October 2001 until July 2005. Previously she was also appointed to serve as the first Director, Employment Discrimination Project.

Upon joining the Attorney General's Office in 1992, Ms. Ziehl served as an Assistant Attorney General in the Trial Division, Government Bureau, through September, 1996. Ms. Ziehl was the Attorney General's representative to the joint Department of Justice, Equal Employment Opportunity Commission and National Association of Attorneys General's Civil Rights Employment Task Force beginning in October 2001 and has also been appointed as Section Council Member over the years to the Massachusetts Bar Association's Labor and Employment Law Section and Individual Rights and Responsibilities Section; and the Boston Bar Association's Labor and Employment Law Section.

Prior to joining the Office of the Attorney General, Ms. Ziehl was a litigator with the law firm Silver Golub & Teitel, in Stamford, Connecticut, from September 1987 until November 1992 and clerked for Justice David Borden, at the Connecticut Appellate Court. Ms. Ziehl is a graduate of Mount Holyoke College and the University of Connecticut School of Law.
