Joel J. Berner is the Chief of Enforcement, Massachusetts Commission Against Discrimination. As a senior manager and principal advisor to the agency Chairman and Commissioners, Mr. Berner oversees the investigation and prosecution of citizen discrimination complaints through management of the Enforcement Division. Prior to his present position, Mr. Berner served as the Director of Investigations, Massachusetts Department of Youth Services, where he was a senior manager and principal advisor to the agency executive staff. Before that Mr. Berner was employed as the Acting Chief in the Office of Investigative Services, Massachusetts Department of Correction. In that position he was a senior manager and member of the agency command staff.

From 1992-2005, Mr. Berner served as Legal Counsel, Massachusetts Department of Correction, and from 1988-1992, Mr. Berner served as a Captain in the United States Army, Judge Advocate General's Corps.

Mr. Berner holds degrees from Boston University (BA, 1984), New England School of Law (JD, 1987), and the United States Army War College (Masters, National Strategic Studies, 2006). From 1992 to present, Mr. Berner has served in the United States Army Reserve, Judge Advocate General Corps.
