## **Quincy man pleads not guilty in deadly bar assault, ordered held**

Paul J. Fahey, 42, of Lind St., Quincy pled not guilty to a single count of murder in the Quincy District Court on April 6, 2015 in the beating death of another city man at a local bar, according to Norfolk District Attorney Michael W. Morrissey.

Judge Mark Coven ordered him held without bail at the request of Assistant District Attorney Craig Kowalski. Defense attorney at the hearing was Michael Cioffi.

Fahey had previously pled not guilty at his April 1, 2015 arraignment on assault and battery resulting in serious bodily injury and assault and battery with a dangerous weapon charges for allegedly assaulting Keith W. Boudreau inside the Home Ice Sports Bar in the City of Quincy on March 23, 2015.

More than a dozen friends and family members of the victim attended the arraignments. The family asked the District Attorney's Office to disseminate the following statement on their behalf. The statement was prepared and issued while Mr. Boudreau was alive and hospitalized following the apparently unprovoked assault.

### **Statement from the family of Keith W. Boudreau:**

First of all, we want to thank everyone who has reached out and shown their support and love. We also want to thank the Quincy and State Police for gathering the facts and identifying the defendant. We are very grateful to them. Keith is a loving, caring son, father and brother. He has two wonderful boys, 15 and 8, whom he loves very much. And they think the world of him. Keith is the kindest person. Even on his worst days, he is kinder than most. He would not hurt a person; he just didn't have it in him. He knew no color barriers, he didn't judge people.

At this time, he is not being sustained by life support and he is not expected to live. The family is asking for privacy at this time.
