

**IN RE: JEREMY ULYSSES BLACKOWICZ****NO. BD-2015-054****S.J.C. Order of Term Suspension/Stayed entered by Justice Hines on July 16, 2015.¹****SUMMARY²**

The respondent, Jeremy Ulysses Blackowicz, was admitted to the bar of the Commonwealth on January 22, 2002. The respondent also practices before the United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO). On May 22, 2015, the USPTO issued an order suspending the respondent for thirty days, with a thirteen-month probationary period. The USPTO's order was based on findings that the respondent, *inter alia*, engaged in a conflict of interest by simultaneously representing clients with conflicting interests without informed consent, accepted compensation from a third party to represent a client without the client's informed consent, and failed to abide by a client's decisions concerning the objectives of representation, all in violation of several provisions of 37 C.F.R., sections 10 and 11.

On June 10, 2015, bar counsel filed a petition for reciprocal discipline, pursuant to S.J.C. Rule 4:01, § 16, and the order of the USPTO. On July 10, 2015, the respondent and bar counsel executed and filed with the Court a waiver of hearing and an assent to entry of order.

On July 16, 2015, the Court (Hines, J.) entered an order suspending the respondent for a period of thirty days, with the execution of the suspension stayed for a period of one year, subject to conditions including that the respondent take and pass the MPRE, and that he meet with a specified practice monitor at least quarterly to review his compliance with the Massachusetts Rules of Professional Conduct.
