Scenario	Answer
Licensee did not attend any of the required continuing education classes but sent in and received his or her license	A fine of \$100.00 per hour missed (\$1,200.00)
	Six months Probation
	Must make up all classes missed
Licensee has attended only one of the required continuing education classes but sent in and received his or her license	A fine of \$100.00 per hour missed (\$600.00)
	Six months Probation
	Must make up all classes missed
Licensee sent in and received his or her license prior to taking the required classes but ended up taking the classes after the renewal date of May 1, 2010	A fine of \$100.00 per hour missed after May 1, 2010
	Must make up all classes missed
Licensee sent in and received his or her license prior to taking the required classes but ended up taking the classes prior to the renewal date of May 1, 2010	An advisory letter will be sent
Licensee has not taken the required classes but chose to not send in their renewal to date	No action
	Must make up all classes missed prior to renewal
Licensee received an audit notice with their renewal: signed, paid and sent in the renewal without CE certificate copies to the Board office	Will not receive a license until after completion of the classes, copies of the certificates are submitted to the Board office
Licensee received an audit notice with their renewal and chose not to send it back because they had not taken the required classes	Will not receive a license until after completion of the classes, copies of the certificates are submitted to the Board office
A Master Plumber took out a permit with a valid license on April 20, 2010. He was unable to renew his license on May 1, 2010 because he was audited and did not take the classes. What happens with the permit?	Although the permit was issued properly in April, it is no longer valid because of his current audit status. Once the plumber renewed his or her license, the permit may then be considered valid.
A Master Plumber who was in audit status took out a permit in June of 2010 but the inspector neglected to check the status of his license at the time. What happens with the permit?	The permit should never have been issued because the Master Plumber did not have a valid license at the time. The permit would not be valid. The Master Plumber may be subject to disciplinary action for unlicensed practice.
